Tye began working for Nottingham City Council in 1990 as an Information Advice Worker in a special BME project called Ukaidi. The work involved advising, supporting and representing members of the BME community on Housing, Education, Employment and Immigration issues as well as organising public meetings and developing self help groups.

In 1994, Tye gained the position of Research Officer and was trained in computer skills, project management, fieldwork, data collection and data analysis. These combined with good communications skills help him to develop a solid network of GMB membership which still exists today. During his time as representative he recruited and serviced members from all backgrounds ranging from the lowest paid to the highest paid.

He was appointed Regional Organiser in October 2000 and has since worked tirelessly on establishing and developing the organisation and growth of the GMB membership. In his time as Organiser, Tye has been responsible for membership in every section of the Union and involved in collective bargaining in a wide range of organisations and companies. As Race Officer, Tye successfully maintained the Race advisory Committee and organised Regional Race Conferences and delegations to National Race Conferences for several years. More recently he has taken on the lead role in developing the Regional Equality Forum and as part of this programme established GMB Equality Contacts for each area of equality including for retired and elderly members. Tye is currently responsible for representing and servicing 4,500 members across the East Midlands and for negotiating with employers such as Nottingham City Council, Nottinghamshire Constabulary, Nottingham Trent University, Djanogly, Thompson Solicitors, The Legal Services Commission and several others.

Tye held the position of Chairperson of the Shefton Youth Group and the Supplementary Schools Management Committee and Finance Sub-Group from November 2000 to November 2005.
